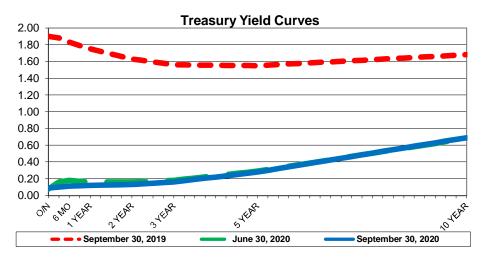

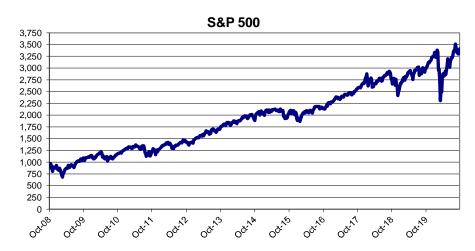

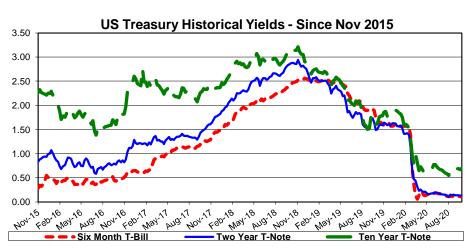
Economic Overview 9/30/2020

The Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) maintained the Fed Funds target range at 0.00% to 0.25% (Effective Fed Funds are trading +/-0.10%), and projected that reduced rates could remain through 2024. Final estimate of Second Quarter GDP revised to down 31.4% (from down 31.9%). The Yield Curve remained stable. Crude oil slid to below \$40 per barrel. September Non Farm Payroll added 661k workers. Business added over 800k, but governments shed 200+k. The Stock Markets retreated slightly from all-time highs. Housing strengthened due to low mortgage rates. Additional federal economic assistance remained stalled in Congress.







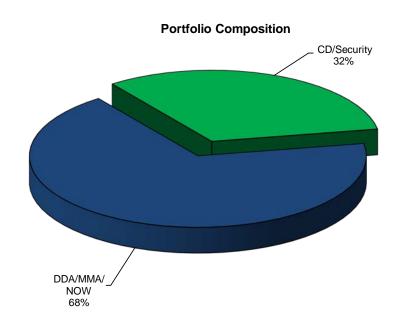


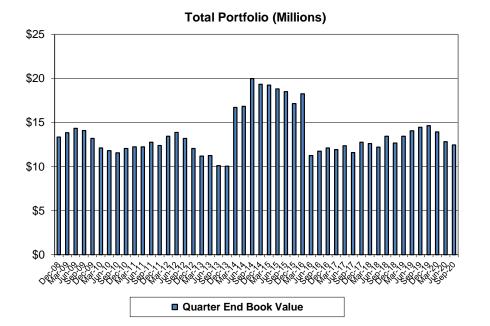

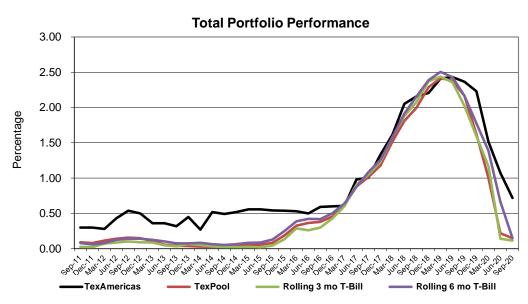

WHEREAS, TexAmericas Center's purpose is to promote and enhance the creation of jobs and new industries and commercial activities upon the Real Property formerly known as Lone Star Army Ammunition Plant and a portion of Red River Army Depot, both located in Bowie County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, TexAmericas Center seeks to provide and develop new services and operations to enhance its ability to attract new business and commercial and economic development to its property; and

WHEREAS, TexAmericas Center believes that it is in the best interest of TexAmericas Center, citizens of Bowie County, and job creation that it request certain amendments be made to Chapter 3503 of the Texas Special District Local Laws Code to accomplish its goals and statutory powers and functions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of TexAmericas Center that it request the Texas Legislature to amend Chapter 3503 of the Texas Special District Local Laws Code to modify the statute in the following respects:

- 1. Add a new Subsection (27) to Section 3503.101(b) to allow TexAmericas Center to provide services and operate facilities for a fee, either inside, or outside, the boundaries of the Authority and the State of Texas to promote, enhance, develop or assist persons, entities, or companies interested in creating new businesses, industries, and commercial activities on the property.
- 2. Amend Chapter 3503 by adding a new Section 3503.113 to provide that the Authority has all of the powers, authorities, duties and rights as a defense-based development authority created pursuant to Chapter 379B, Texas Local Government Code, as if the authority were created pursuant to Chapter 379B.
- 3. Add new Section 3503.205 and 3503.206 as suggested by TexAmericas Center's Bond Council to enhance the ability of the Authority to issue bonds and credit agreements to provide funds for the projects of the Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Scott Norton, Executive Director/CEO shall be and he is hereby authorized to take such actions as may be necessary to introduce such legislation, including the

publication of Notice of Special Legislation as required by the Texas Constitution and the Texas Government Code, and to work with representatives in Texas Legislature to accomplish the amendments to the statute.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to authorization of TexAmericas Center to act as a Defense Base Development Authority, provide services to entities to enhance and develop its properties, and to delegate actions and enter into credit agreements in connection with bonds.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 3503, Special District Local Laws Code, Section 3503.101(b) is amended by adding a new subsection (27) to read as follows:

(27) provide services and operate facilities for a fee either inside, or outside, the boundaries of the

Authority and this State to promote, enhance, develop, or assist persons, entities or companies interested in creating new businesses, industries and commercial activities on the Property.

SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 3503, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Section 3503.113 to read as follows:

Sec. 3503.113. Powers and Authorities of a Defense Base Development Authority.

- (a) The authority shall have all the powers, authorities, duties and rights as a Defense Base Development Authority created pursuant to Chapter 379B, Texas Local Government Code as if the authority were created pursuant to said Chapter 379B.
- (b) In the event of a conflict between Chapter 379B of the Local Government Code and this Chapter 3503 of Special District Local Laws Code, the provisions of this Chapter 3503 shall prevail and control the authority.

SECTION 3. Chapter 3503, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Section 3503.205 to read as follows:

Sec. 3503.205. CREDIT AGREEMENT. In connection with the issuance of bonds under this chapter, the board may exercise the authority granted to the governing body of an issuer with regard

to the execution and delivery of a credit agreement under Chapter 1371, Government Code.

SECTION 4. Chapter 3503, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Section 3503.206 to read as follows:

Sec. 3503.206. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY. (a) In connection with the issuance of bonds, the board may:

- (1) prescribe the maximum principal amount of bonds to be issued and the maximum rate of interest the bonds may bear;
- (2) recite the public purpose for which the bonds are to be issued;
- (3) delegate to any officer or employee of the authority the authority to effect the sale of the bonds; and
- (4) determine the period during which the delegation authority under Subdivision (3) may be exercised.
- (b) In exercising the authority delegated by the board to an officer or employee, the officer or employee may establish the terms and details related to the issuance and sale of the bonds, including:
 - (1) the form and designation of the bonds;
- (2) the principal amount of the bonds and the amount of the bonds to mature in each year;
 - (3) the dates, price, interest rates, interest payment dates,

principal payment dates, and redemption features of the bonds;

- (4) the execution of agreements determined by the officer or employee to be necessary in connection with the issuance of the bonds; and
- (5) any other details relating to the issuance and sale of the bonds as specified by the board in the proceedings authorizing the issuance of the bonds.
- (c) A finding or determination made by an officer or employee acting under the authority delegated to the officer or employee has the same force and effect as a finding or determination made by the board.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if this Act receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this section takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.

Notice is hereby given that TexAmericas Center intends to request the introduction of a Bill in the 2021 Regular Session of the Texas Legislature, the general purposes, nature and substance of which are as follows:

- 1. Grant to TexAmericas Center the full powers, authorities, duties and rights as a defense based development authority created pursuant to Chapter 379B, Texas Local Government Code.
- 2. Authorize TexAmericas Center to provide services and operate facilities for a fee to promote, enhance, develop or assist persons, entities or companies interested in creating new businesses, industries and commercial activities upon the property of TexAmericas Center.
- 3. Amend the provisions authorizing the issuance of bonds and credit agreements to finance construction of projects upon the property of TexAmericas Center.

This general description of the provisions to be contained in such Bill is not intended to be exclusive, but only to express the general purpose, nature and substance thereof. The Bill may also contain other provisions and confer other powers and connection with the general purpose, nature and substance stated above.

This Notice is given in accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section 57 and Article 16, Section 59(d) of the Texas Constitution and Section 313.002 of the Texas Government Code.

MW Builders, Inc. also agreed to assign the Mechanic's Lien Contract to a lender which agrees to provide loan proceeds to facilitate payment of the Contract Sum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of TexAmericas Center that the Executive Director/CEO shall be and he is hereby authorized to continue construction on the Design-Build Amendment, AIA Document AI414-2014 while finalizing financing for said project and any necessary budget adjustments needed.
